

Introductory incident

A morning between Oct.2-Oct.15, 1975

Description:

One early, darkish morning sometime between Oct. 2 and Oct. 15, 1975, I was cycling to the train station on the long, curved street by the large, low part of a grassy area without bushes.

No one was down there, when about 15 yards (14 meters) away from me there was a silent and quick series of 6 very white, large, energy flash explosions, formed as five-pointed stars. First number 1, then after a very short pause numbers 2 then 3, another very short pause and 4 then 5, and after double the usual pause length, number 6 at some distance and out of line with the others.

The contrast between the bright, large, silent flashes and the returning darkish scene, made me think of the unexplainable, the other-worldly. Late the next afternoon, I investigated the damp field for leftovers of firecrackers or other clues, and found nothing. I told no one of it, but found the experience valuable, puzzling, and troubling.

Total time about 3-4 seconds.

Later comparison of events:

This earliest experience was perhaps a mild preview of a factor in coming actual UFO events. The silent energy explosions had the same star form, bright color, and coordinated timing as the series of flashes in my later UFO sightings of Dec. 28, 1975 and April 27, 1976.
